New subscription rate for 2019

The Magazine Committee which oversees the production of the Clogher Diocesan Magazine has reluctantly had to increase the subscription rate of the monthly magazine.

The magazine has kept its cover price static for many years but this has not been sufficient to meet increasing costs.

From February 2019, the price of the magazine will be \pounds 1.50 (1.65 Euro) for each edition or \pounds 15 (16.50 Euro) for the 10 issues in the calendar year.

The magazine has expanded its coverage of parish and diocesan events and the Committee will continue to ensure readers get good value for money.

ANOTE FROM THE BISHOP



Dear Friends,

If I had to choose one word which, in a religious sense, is most closely associated with Christmas that word would be "Glory". Whether it is the seemingly unending "gloooooria" of Gloria in Excelsis Deo or from the beauty of the description in St John's Gospel that "we have beheld his glory, as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth". Indeed in one of his many remarkable books, Archbishop Michael Ramsey described Christmas as, simply, "Glory, descending".

But what exactly was entailed in the glory that the shepherds, the angels and the Gospel writers witnessed, not only in Bethlehem but also in Galilee, in Samaria and most of all on the hill outside the city of Jerusalem? It very clearly was not the sort of glory which many people think about today when they use that word. It had nothing to do with either fame or reputation and even

less to do with the gilded lifestyle of the rich and famous (or even the average Clogher parishioner).

That little passage from St John talks of it being "full of grace and truth". Gracious in that he is given as a gift and truthful in that his words and deeds are not only trustworthy but express the very nature of God. To use another phrase of Michael Ramsey's "God is like Christ and in him is no unchristlikeness at all".

So,although God's own glory can be seen in every phase of Jesus life, and the same Gospel writer goes on to associate that glory most intensely with the Cross, it is also to be clearly seen in Bethlehem.

And it is hard to escape the conclusion that a major element in the glory of God as we see it in that human life is that he became poor. He hadn't poverty foisted upon him by an unjust social

system (there is no glory in that) nor by some shortcomings in his character (he went about doing good). But he chose a certain way of life and adopted a certain attitude to possessions as reflecting the glory of God.

Going back to Michael Ramsey.

"The stable is a symbol of Christ's poverty. The characteristic that gave him the title 'poor' was his simplicity. He did without many of the things that people crave. None did he criticise more severely than those who hankered after more and more possessions and were preoccupied with money.

The worth of a person's life, he insisted, does not consist of possessions, for piling things up does not increase worth. People matter more than things because people have an eternal destiny".

How did Christ become poor? By coming to share in the limitations, frustrations and hard realities of our human life, our pains, our sorrows and even our death. This has a moral message to learn and to live by too. It is the message of simplicity and self-sacrifice.

Christ gave himself to us to enable us to give ourselves to one another: that is the message of Bethlehem to a world in trouble. And trouble is what we are in.

The last word to Michael Ramsey:

"Come to Bethlehem once again: see the stable, see the child. Knowing that he is God made man, knowing that he who was rich has become poor for us - let us kneel in the darkness and cold that is the symbol of our cold and chilly hearts, and say in a new way, 'yours is the kingdom the power and the "glory" for ever."

And may the glory of Christ surround you and your families and all those who you love this Christmas time.





Remembrance

As we marked the centenary of the Armistice at our Remembrance service this year, yet mindful of the cost, the lost generations, the joys and sorrows that peace brought on 11th November 1918, we did with a sense of deepest gratitude and of the pursuit of a lasting peace. A peace firmly grounded on truth and justice and on the Prince of Peace, Jesus Christ. The service conducted by the Rector, was a fitting tribute to the fallen in two World Wars, subsequent wars, conflicts and terrorism. After the Roll of Honour, Last Post, two minutes silence, Reveille, wreathes were laid at the memorials and the children paid their own tribute as in previous years as the piper played 'Nearer my God to Thee'. The Rector took as his text, "When a man's ways please the Lord, He makes even His enemies to be at peace with him." Proverbs 16:7

At the conclusion of the service, the Rector shared a few words of tribute penned earlier that morning, before the piper led off with the tune, 'The Battle's O'er'. Afterwards a poppy wreath was laid outside on the grave of Private Jim Oldman who was murdered by terrorists. The bell rang out at 11.00am marking the Armistice signing and again at 12.30pm to mark the move from remembrance to celebration of peace.

WW1 Remembrance - North Fermanagh and Pettigo Remembers



saw it. It stopped raining. The sun came out, a rainbow came out, she said 'let's get this take' and they shot the take. When she said 'cut,' it started to rain again.'


Garris went on to explain how that moment will live as a testament to her father's relationship to God, and how this film has the capability to impact even those who

It would seem that in the past this time of year was marked with fasting to various degrees and I am sure you will be glad that I am not advocating this practice today. However that does not mean that I am not going to challenge you in what I say. I truly believe that the season of Advent provides an opportunity for each one of us to look at our lives and see where we can do better. We should view this time of year as being one when we look at our lives with a critical eye and see what we need to change. As we look forward to Christmas we should consider the year past and see where we


400th Anniversary Service

A Service of Choral Evensong was held in St Macartin's Cathedral, Enniskillen on Sunday 4th November to celebrate the 400th Anniversary of the Opening of the Royal School in Fermanagh. The service was conducted by the Dean of Clogher, the Very Rev Kenneth Hall and the preacher was the Rt Rev David Chillingworth, the former Primus of the Scottish Episcopal Church, a former pupil of Portora Royal School and a former choir boy in St Macartin's Cathedral.

The Battle's Over

A Nations tribute is now complete and it was marked in style in Enniskillen, the most Westerly location in the UK to take part. We replicated some of the events of 100 years ago, when Enniskillen was the first place to learn of the armistice, with search lights, sky rockets and the peal of St Macartin's Cathedral bells. The clock face on the Cathedral was backlit for the first time and now will shine for evermore as a sign of peace, hope and reconciliation in our

community symbolising the light of Christ shining forth from our lives! A united morning service for all denominations was held in St Macartin's Cathedral, recorded live on RTE, was conducted by the Dean, the Very Revd Kenneth Hall and the preacher was the Bishop of Clogher, the Right Revd John McDowell. Afterwards the Cathedral bells rang out at 12.30pm as suggested by Her Majesty's Government to move from a mood of 'remembrance' to that of 'celebration' that the Great War had ended. In the evening time the four main churches joined in a united service of 'Hope, Peace, Light and Love' as Church of Ireland, Presbyterian and Methodist congregations processed to St Michael's Roman Catholic Church following their lantern of light, that was given to all four clergy at the 6.00am service at Enniskillen Castle by Her Majesty's Lord Lieutenant for Co Fermanagh. St Michael's was filled to capacity with almost 1000 people and a massive crowd outside (estimated at another 1000) brought the town centre to a standstill After a moving service in St Michael's Church a flame of light led the way to St Macartin's cathedral grounds (across the street) where Viscount Brookeborough HML lit a beacon. The crowds crossing the street were greeted by a massed band of 100 pipers and drummers drawn from all bands throughout the county. A spectacle to behold! At the same time as the beacon was lit the Cathedral Clock was lit, the Cathedral bells pealed again and sky rockets lit up the night sky. Two beams of light one from each side of the street crossed over each other



symbolising - two churches, two beams of light but one community united in love and respect of each other and for those who gave their lives 100 years ago, that we might celebrate freedom! (See photos below).


A very Merry Christmas to all our friends across the Diocese.

The names were read out accompanied by the Silver Tones Choir. Ballinamallard Silver Band and Helen Blair provided the music for the hymns. Revd Alan Irwin delivered the sermon and said that the ultimate peace is that from Jesus Christ. The service was conducted by Revd Canon Henry Blair, assisted by Revd Philip Bryson, Revd Steven Foster and Fr Frank McManus.

Sunday the 16th December (Advent 3) is called Gaudete Sunday and this is a children's service in both churches. It's a morning for Christmas jumpers.

Advent and Gaudete Sunday

While the theme of Advent is a focus on the coming of Jesus in three ways: His first, His present and His final Advent, the readings for Gaudete Sunday deal with rejoicing in the Lord — Christian joy — as well as the mission of St. John the Baptist and his connection with Advent.

The theologian Henri Nouwen described the difference between joy and happiness. While happiness is dependent on external conditions, joy is "the experience of knowing that you are unconditionally loved and that nothing -- sickness, failure, emotional distress, oppression, war, or even death -- can take that love away. Thus joy can be present even in the midst of sadness

Gaudete Sunday is referred to as the "Sunday of joy," and that instead of fretting about "all they still haven't" done to prepare for Christmas, people should "think of all the good things life has given you."

On Gaudete Sunday rose-coloured vestments may be worn instead of violet (or instead of blue, in the Anglican and some Lutheran and other Protestant traditions). which is otherwise prescribed for every day in the season of Advent. Gaudete Sunday was also known as "Rose Sunday". In churches that have an Advent Wreath, the rose-coloured candle is lit in addition to two of the violet coloured candles, which represent the first two Sundays of Advent. Despite the otherwise somber readings of the season of Advent, which has as a secondary theme the need for penitence, the readings on the third Sunday emphasize the joyous anticipation of the Lord's coming.

A note from the Rector 'Meekness and maiestv....'

Graham Kendrick is a well-known singer song-writer who has composed many modern worship songs some of which have made their way into our Irish Church Hymnal - 'Shine, Jesus, Shine'; 'The Servant King' and 'Meekness and Majesty' are fine examples. 'Meekness and Majesty' has a chorus with the words:

'O what a mystery, meekness and majesty, bow down and worship, for this is your God' The mystery it sings about is the paradox that the baby born in a stable at Christmas, should be at the same time the majestic Son of God who sits enthroned in heaven. This amazing belief of the Christian faith is something which we cannot fully understand yet is revealed to us in the scripture readings we use in the Advent - Christmas period. St Paul speaks of '... the revelation of the mystery that was kept secret for long ages but is now disclosed...' Romans 16.25

So, what is the mystery? It's the amazing secret, that eternal life is God's free gift to the world because he loves us and wishes us to love him in return. As we approach Christmas may we marvel at that paradox: - that combining meekness and majesty in the person of the baby in a manger is the mystery which brings us salvation. Parish Facilities Development Plans

A Sub-Committee of The Select Vestry has been working on proposals to upgrade and extend the Parish Hall, provide new fellowship and Sunday School facilities (incorporating the Stables building) and extending the off road car parking facilities, for well over a year now.

The plans were approved by the Representative Church Body in early September, so, the next stage will be to submit an application to the Planning Service for approval to build. The Architect is presently working on detailed drawing for this application.

With assistance from the Fermanagh and Omagh District Council, the Parish commissioned a Comprehensive Feasibility Study with a firm called Venturei. The report has now been prepared and will reflect the views of the 140 replies to our survey to tweak and improve the plans prior to applying for planning permission.

COMHAR (pronounced "Core") Originally meaning co-operative ploughing between neighbours, this Irish word now evokes the general notion of co-operation and shared work. It can also be translated as partnership - the key principal for this CIYD scheme. We are happy to say that as part of this scheme a group of 40 young leaders (15-18yrs) from Clogher and Connor dioceses will be funded to attend a young leader's training weekend from the 8-10th of February 2019.

The group will be part of the IMYC "Overflow" weekend. Our continued partnership with the Methodist youth department has proved very beneficial as we have recently again attended their Autumn Soul (13-18yrs) weekend. The Comhar weekend is for young people who show Youth Ministry leadership potential. Youth leaders do not need to attend with their young people. Overflow is a weekend where we encourage and equip young people to










Raising their voices at the BIG SING

Enniskillen re-enacts the ending of the First World War 100 years later

Enniskillen was the most westerly location in the United Kingdom to take part in "The Battle's Over - A Nation's Tribute" marking the centenary of the ending of the First World War over the past weekend. Some of the events which took place in the town in 1918 were re-enacted. For example Enniskillen was the first place to hear of the Armistice and they announced this to townspeople with search lights, sky rockets and the peal of St Macartin's Cathedral bells.

All these were re-created on Sunday as well as backlighting the clock face on the tower of the Cathedral for the first time. "It will now shine as a sign of peace, hope and reconciliation in the community symbolising the light of Christ shining forth from our lives!" said Dean Kenneth Hall. After a morning service for all denominations in St Macartin's Cathedral, when the preacher was the Bishop of Clogher, the Right Revd John McDowell, broadcast live on RTE television, the Cathedral bells rang out at 12.30pm to move from a mood of 'remembrance' to that of 'celebration' that the Great War had ended.

On Sunday evening the four main churches joined in a united service of 'Hope, Peace, Light and Love' as Church of Ireland,

Presbyterian and Methodist congregations processed to St Michael's Roman Catholic Church following lanterns of light, given to all four clergy at the

6.00am service at Enniskillen Castle by Her Majesty's Lord Lieutenant, Viscount Brookeborough for Co Fermanagh. St Michael's Church was filled to capacity with almost 1000 people and an estimated 1000 people gathered outside. After a moving service in St Michael's Church, a flame of light led the way to St Macartin's Cathedral grounds across the street where Lord Brookeborough lit a beacon. The crowds crossing the street were greeted by a massed band of 100 pipers and drummers drawn from all bands throughout the county who played hymns

including "Abide With Me." At the same time as the beacon was lit, the Cathedral Clock was lit for the first time in its history, the Cathedral bells pealed again and sky rockets lit up the night sky. Two beams of light, one from each side of the street crossed over each other symbolising two churches, two beams of light but one community united in love and respect of each other and for those who gave their lives 100 years ago.

A Service of the Word for the Commemoration of the End of the First World War was held in Lisbellaw Parish Church on Sunday 25th November 2018 at 7pm when the preacher was the Bishop of Clogher, the Right Revd John McDowell.

The service was the culmination of five year's work in the area. initiated by the Select Vestry in Lisbellaw. The project started with 99 names on two memorial stones in Lisbellaw and Derryvullan Churches and a desire to tell the stories of those who had served in the First World War, as well as all those who made the ultimate sacrifice in the parish, irrespective of their denomination.

The Service of the Word for the Commemoration of the End of the First World had a special focus on those who served and returned from the Great War

This was the last event in a project which saw the publication in November 2016 of a book, "The Stories Behind the Stones -Lisbellaw and the Great War" which recorded 197 men and women from the area who served in the First World War.

The Church of Ireland safeguarding policies and procedure applies to all clergy, staff and volunteers but especially those who have regular contact with children or adults who may be more at risk of harm or abuse because of their personal or life circumstances. The guidance applies to all aspects of ministry in the Church of Ireland whether within a church building or within parishioners' homes. It is the responsibility of everyone in the Church of Ireland to ensure that children and adults at risk of harm due to their personal characteristics and/or life circumstances are not left at risk of abuse. Church organisations have a duty to promote the safety, welfare and thereby safeguard children and adults at risk. Church of Ireland Safeguarding Board

The Church of Ireland Safeguarding Board is authorised by Standing Committee to ensure that those within Church ministry are aware of their special duty of care towards Children and Adults at Risk and therefore a culture of collective responsibility to work in partnership with other statutory, community and voluntary organisations is encouraged.

The Safeguarding Board will promote human rights which are embedded in both our gospel values and within international and domestic laws to protect those at risk of harm.



Church's climate change seminar advises parishes how to work with the environment

Parishioners of churches across the country need to look at how they interact with the environment as climate change and pollution is affecting people in countries across the world, a seminar on climate change and the environment heard recently. The Church of Ireland has already begun to react, passing a motion at this year' General Synod for full divestment from fossil fuels. The seminar "Climate Change and the Environment" organised by the Church and Society Commission in Church House. Belfast, heard from a number of speakers on various aspects of how climate change is affecting communities. June Butler introduced the seminar with thoughts on praying and acting for the environment; Stephen Trew, who proposed the motion at General Synod gave a biblical perspective on the environment; David Thomas from Christian Aid gave his thoughts on Climate change's impact on the developing world and David Ritchie, Chief Executive Officer of the RCB gave a thought-provoking talk on Practical action in parish life.

Mr Ritchie said the issue should challenge



thinking in parish life and there were lots of traditional responses to creation. He said the Church had looked at the

environment as well as recycling and waste but wondered "how do we as Christians and parishes respond?" He referred firstly to theology, citing the

Parable of Talents from Matthew 25. He said one of the issues is about stewardship. He gave ideas under three headings; resources, individuals and parishes using influence and faith, looking at waste, whether people are using public transport or sharing lifts or sharing books. For

parishes he said parishioners need to engage with the community and value the environment, to renew their appreciation of nature.

He asked: "How can we in churches value God's creation more. He then listed ways that parishes could contribute by organising "environmentally friendly" activities such as fetes or car boot sales where items would be recycled, picnics or barbecues outdoors, organising hikes or cycles, camping, farm trips or vacations and harvest parties. There were also some suggestions of a plastic free event where no plastics would be used, using Fairtrade food or introducing an environmental rating when inspecting church properties.

Eco-congregational Ireland suggests environmental measures at practical level including reduce, reuse, recycle and compost, using LED light bulbs and reduce thermostat readings, using eco-friendly cleaning materials and supporting and promoting Fairtrade.

Some of those in the audience went further by suggesting a number of lifestyle issues such as reducing meat in the diet, questioning the use of bought-in flowers grown in developing countries where the land could be used for growing food. The RCB has set an example by setting up beehives in the grounds of Church House in Dublin to increase urban pollination. David Thomas from Christian Aid speaking on "The impact of climate change in the developing world" said everyone would be affected by changes in the weather but for some it would mean survival, life and death. He said climate change can destroy livelihoods whether those of fishermen in the Philippines or the cattle herders in Kenya.


He quoted examples of communities in some countries currently affected. The Dogon community of Mali, for example, depended on a community meal. He said for westerners, food security is not a big issue going to a supermarket. However major climatic conditions can

affect people around the world. Storms, drought, disease, floods, rising sea level and conflict are all affected by climate change. Yet despite this, Mr. Thomas said that these people in the developing world were also part of the solution. Innovative initiatives such as solar powered ovens are being installed to allow people cook meals in the Amazon basin or in Africa solar powered shops are able to run a fridge and power





outlets to charge mobile homes. "Climate change is very much a justice issue." he said. Stephen Trew, an environmental campaigner, who proposed the motion at General Synod, said that scriptures can give hope and added that the environment

The General Synod commended the Environmental Charter for the use of parishes in the Church of Ireland. Summarised, it recommends; - As with other Christians, members of the Church of Ireland are charged with stewardship of God's creation through reducing waste,

- increasing environmental awareness, exercising leadership through environmental responsibility

- identifying spiritually and practically with the developing world

- influencing policy and the Church and State

"In all of this, prayer for decision makers and those who are impacted by environmental issues should be at the heart of the Church's response," it states.

Brexit: Church leaders' ioint statement

The leaders of the main churches in Ireland have issued the following joint statement in relation to Brexit.

As the final stages of the initial part of the negotiations for the United Kingdom to leave the European Union draw to a close, we as Church Leaders here on the island of Ireland are inspired by the challenge of Jesus to love our neiahbour.

Relationships between the people of this island, both North and South, and between the Republic of Ireland and the United Kingdom, have improved and deepened immeasurably over the past 30 or so years. This atmosphere of mutual respect, understanding and growing friendship has been the positive background against which many significant developments have taken place - ceasefires, political accommodation, increased connectedness and rising prosperity for many.

It is important that we acknowledge the legitimate aspirations of those who voted to leave the European Union and those who voted to remain. We also pray at this time that the inevitable tensions, which the Brexit negotiations and their outworking will entail, will not be allowed to undermine the quality of relationships and mutual understanding which are both so important in enabling all of us to work together for the common good. In this context, we particularly want to encourage public representatives, and all others who give leadership in our society, to weigh their words carefully, to respect the integrity of those who conscientiously differ from them and to speak with grace. Regardless of the outcome of this process, as peoples and communities who share this island, we will remain closely related and will have to both get along together and work together in this changing and somewhat uncertain world that lies ahead. This calling will be helped immensely as we all strive to listen and relate to one another in the context of mutual respect and even growing trust, rather in a divisive and unhealthy atmosphere of needlessly destructive debate and broken and fractured relationships.

The Porvoo Declaration commits the Churches which have signed it 'to share a common life' and 'to pray for and with one another'. An important way of doing this is to pray through the year for the Porvoo Churches and their dioceses.

The Prayer Diary is a list of Porvoo Communion dioceses or Churches covering each Sunday of the year, mindful of the many calls upon compilers of intercessions, and the environmental and production costs of printing a more elaborate list. Those using the calendar are invited to choose one day each week on which they will pray for the Porvoo Churches.

It is hoped that individuals and parishes, cathedrals and religious orders will make use of the Calendar in their own cycle of prayer week by week.

In addition to the Churches which have approved the Porvoo Declaration, we continue to pray for Churches with observer status. Observers attend all the meetings held under the Agreement.

Re-dedication of church following major refurbishment

A Service of Re-Dedication has taken place in the Priory Church, Killadeas, following a major renovation costing around £120,000 and supported by the Heritage Lottery Fund.

The Bishop of Clogher, the Right Revd John McDowell carried out the re-dedication during the service on Sunday afternoon, 25th November. A number of gifts were also dedicated including; Sound System in memory of Ivan Bradshaw by his wife and family and New Carpet in the Chancel and Baptistry by Joanne Hale in memory of Jack and Betty Armstrong.

The Priory Church one of the two Church of Ireland parishes in the grouping of Trory and Killadeas, is one of the historic churches on a site linked with early Christian settlements and a monastic order on Devenish Island is currently undergoing a significant restoration project on its stonework to protect it for future generations.

Built in 1881, the church stands on a site with an adjacent churchyard which contains elaborately-carved stones nearing pre-Christian symbolism. Stones from a previous church building known as the Yellow Church, because of the colour of the stonework, were incorporated into the archway which separates the nave from the choir and chancel.

The church also has close connections with the Irvine family who originally came into the Rockfield area of Killadeas in 1660. The Irvine estate was a major employer in the area and bequeathed the estate parish church.

However the church has suffered from the effects of penetrating damp in both the tower and the main body of the church. Heavy and continuous rain has resulted in water streaming down the inside of the walls in

some parts of the building. Having been awarded a grant of £65,400 from the Heritage Lottery Fund, a contract was awarded, and work began in April. Mr. Ronald Balfour, one of the Glebewardens at the Priory Church, explained: "The work has been extensive and includes repair work to the tower such as repairing and replacing tower floors, repairing lead flashing, plaster repairs to the parapet, removing render to the interior tower walls, re-pointing the east and west walls as well as carrying out drainage work on the outside of the related foundation areas." Mr Balfour added: "It was very obvious that only a major project would fix the church building and put it back in a fit state so that the church will be available for generations to come. It is only with the support of the

Heritage Lottery Fund grant that made the Priory project possible"

Paul Mullan, Head of Heritage Lottery Fund in Northern Ireland commented: "Heritage Lottery Fund was delighted to offer this funding support to the Priory Church. Places of worship sit at the heart of communities and they are also a key part of our built and cultural heritage. Most rely on the hard work and generosity of local communities and volunteers to keep them in good order but sometimes they need more help. Our funding is an invaluable resource for the repair and reuse of important listed buildings. It is thanks to all the players of the National Lottery that we can fund local projects such as this one."

Opportunities to work abroad with CMSI

CMSI are welcoming teams to join their projects in partner countries in the summer of 2019.

They say that CMSI teams offer a change for groups from Ireland to visit one of the partner locations and experience life, faith and work in another part of the world.

"It's a great way to deepen your understanding of global mission and to help the church to church partnership links grow," they say.

"A CMSI team involves training and preparation in the months before the visit, the experience itself and some follow up

meetings afterwards."

The 2019 teams will visit Madi West Nile, Uganda costing approximately £2200 per person. Applications are open from members of MWN link parishes for those aged 18+. The teams will also visit the Diocese of Egypt costing £1500 per person open to anyone from Ireland aged 16+ and the Diocese of Northern Zambia costing approximately £2000 per person and open to anyone from Ireland aged 18+.
